




The Woodside Historic Preservation Award was created by the Woodside History Committee to celebrate property owners and citizens who demonstrate respect for the historic character of the Town by preserving historic structures or who otherwise contribute to perpetuating Woodside history.



The Woodside History Committee advocates, advises, and develops recommendations regarding matters of Woodside history for the Town. Meetings are held the second Thursday of the month in Independence Hall and are open to the public.

WOODSIDE HISTORIC PRESERVATION AWARD

Woodside has a rich and storied history which defines this special Town. From the indigenous Ohlone and the early pioneers, to the later settlers, each generation has been drawn to this area and left its influence.

Woodside's buildings and sites embody the Town's history and provide a tangible link to residents and events which have contributed to the Town's heritage. These preservation efforts keep Woodside unique. The Historic Preservation Award recognizes the efforts of individuals and organizations which demonstrate a commitment to historic preservation.



The Historic Preservation award will honor exemplary work in one or more of the criteria below. It is the hope of the History Committee that this recognition may inspire others to preserve Woodside's historic and cultural resources, and will increase public awareness of the importance of historic preservation.

AWARD CRITERIA

- Stewardship
- Sensitive remodel, addition, or new construction within an historic context
- Restoration or renovation
- Adaptive reuse
- Advocacy by an individual or group contributing to preservation efforts of the community



The Historic Preservation Award is presented annually in May during National Preservation Month at a ceremony held at the Woodside Community Museum. Award recipients will receive the Historic Preservation plaque along with a certificate of appreciation.

- Applications are available at Woodside Town Hall, at the Community Museum, or may be downloaded from the Town of Woodside website: www.woodsidetown.org
- Nominated projects must be located within the Woodside Town limits.
- Nominations for individuals or groups must be or have been Woodside residents or have made a significant contribution to the history of the Town.
- Selection of award recipients is made by members of the Woodside History Committee.
